

What You Should Know About Accessible Parking

- Parking for persons with disabilities is provided in areas designated as accessible.
- The person with disabilities to whom the plates or placard belongs must exit or enter the vehicle while it is parked in the designated parking area.
- Persons with Disabilities parking placards and license plates **do not** allow parking in restricted parking areas, such as “NO STOPPING” or “NO STANDING” zones, or in front of fire hydrants, bus stops and loading zones.
- Parking is not permitted in access aisles – the spaces marked with lines next to the parking spaces, which accommodate a person maneuvering a wheelchair, crutches or cane out of a vehicle. Violators may be fined.
- Disability plates or placards exempt a vehicle from parking meter fees or time limitations on parking, except for meters, signs or other markings with time limitations of 30 minutes or less in the state of Illinois.
- Violators of accessible parking laws may be fined \$100 or more.
- Disability plates and placards may be revoked if abuse occurs or if obtained through fraudulent means.
